
# Enhanced transparency measures by IMO


#### Boost to domestic Shipbuilding industry



Several initiatives are aimed at boosting the sector. The 2016 Shipbuilding Financial Assistance Policy (2016-2026) offers up to 20% of contract value for vessel construction......read more

Iran is increasing its oil production and finding new buyers despite US sanctions. The country has shipped crude to new markets like Bangladesh and Oman, and its overall output has reached a five-year high. ### An ocean of data

This OECD working paper proposes a methodology for using AIS Data to compute port traffic and activity in "real time/close to real time." This study advances port research by introducing a refined port identification method and developing indicators for port congestion and trade flow analysis. While these indicators require further enhancement with additional data, they offer valuable insights into global and national trade patterns.....read more

# A Novel Technical Framework for Global Shipping Networks

Marine transport drives global trade and economic growth. This study analyses the global shipping network using a novel Laplacian-based framework to assess vessel and route importance, employing 2019 data from the top 30 liner shipping companies. The findings elaborate that Port importance (node significance) does not consistently correlate with centrality measures for most ports.....read more
